

Got a New eReader?

Kobo models released in the past 5 years or so have OverDrive built into the device which can be logged into under the device settings and allows you to cut out connecting your eReader to your computer to transfer eBooks onto the device. Not sure if your device has OverDrive built in?:

1. Select **More** from the toolbar.
2. Select **Settings**.
3. Select **OverDrive**. If there's no **OverDrive** then your model isn't new enough to have OverDrive built in.

Potential Errors

Kindle devices just do not work well with Canadian libraries. They require a specific file type that are not the norm for Canadian libraries. Kobo devices are the way to go!

You can authorize up to 6 devices with a single Adobe ID.

If you change the Adobe ID authorized on your computer or device from jane.doe@gmail.com to john.smith@gmail.com, any eBooks downloaded by jane.doe@gmail.com will not be available to read.

Adobe Digital Editions

Adobe Digital Editions is the program you download to your laptop or desktop computer to read eBooks.

You will need the program if you read eBooks on your computer or eReader from:

- [cloudLibrary](#)
- [OverDrive](#)
- [Read Alberta eBooks](#)

You will need an Adobe ID set up if you:

- Plan on reading eBooks on your eReader

You do not need Adobe Digital Editions if you are reading eBooks on your smartphone or tablet. You should use the **Libby by OverDrive** app on those devices.

Step 1: Get Set Up


To download Adobe Digital Editions for free, go to <http://www.adobe.com/ca/solutions/ebook/digital-editions/download.html>

To create an Adobe ID for free, go to <https://account.adobe.com/>

Once you have Adobe Digital Editions & an Adobe ID set up:

1. Open Adobe Digital Editions software.
2. Select **Help** from the top left.
3. From the menu, select **Authorize Computer** and enter your Adobe ID.
4. Your computer is now set up and you can transfer eBooks to eReaders!

Step 2: Get the eBook



Follow the set up instructions in the Get Set Up section and then:

1. Go to the [OverDrive](#), [cloudLibrary](#), or [Read Alberta eBooks](#) website and borrow an eBook.
2. Go to your account and select the Download button.
3. Open the file on Adobe Digital Editions. Once the eBook has loaded, it will appear in your library on Adobe Digital Editions.

From here, you can simply read your eBook on the computer.

You can see how many days are left on your loan by the banner on top of the cover in the Adobe Digital Editions library. You will no longer be able to open an eBook once your loan is up.

Step 3: Get eBooks on Your eReader



Follow the set up instructions in the **Get Set Up** and **Get the eBook** sections and then:

1. Connect your eReader to the computer.
2. Select **Allow** on your eReader when asked to manage your device files. The name of the device will pop up in the panel on the left of Adobe Digital Editions.
3. Find the book you want in your Adobe Digital Editions library. Click and drag it to the name of the device in the left panel.

You will get a pop up on Adobe Digital Editions if you are trying to add an eBook to your device that is already there.

To see what eBook are already on your device, select the eReader name in the left panel.
